### What will I learn on this course?

This course helps learners use digital devices safely and confidently in everyday life. Learners will practise using computers for work, learning, and personal tasks. The course is supportive and practical, with lots of time to practise and ask questions. Learning is broken into small steps and explained in plain language.

#### By the end of the course, you will be able to:

- Use a digital device (computer, tablet)
- Find information online using search engines
- Communicate using email and online tools
- Create simple digital content (documents, messages)
- Stay safe online, including passwords and privacy
- Solve simple digital problems
- Enter and combine text and other information within word processing documents by using tables tool, mail merge, graphics, and modify page layout.
- Use tools to format and present documents
- Use a spreadsheet to enter, edit and organise numerical and other data and present and format data into charts and graphs.
- Input and combine text and other information in PowerPoint and create slideshow for presentation.

#### What syllabus will I follow?

The syllabus for this course follows the Pearsons Entry 3 framework (Essential Digital Skills Qualification (EDSQ E3)) ensuring a structured and comprehensive learning experience.

#### Who is this course for?

For adults who:

- Can use some digital skills but want to feel more confident
- Want to improve skills for work, job searching, or everyday life
- Want a recognised qualification

### **You will also build skills such as:**

- Confidence – feeling more comfortable using digital devices
- Communication – asking questions, listening, and sharing ideas
- Problem-solving – trying different ways to fix simple digital problems
- Independence – completing tasks with less support over time
- Time management – following steps and finishing tasks in a session
- Resilience – staying calm and trying again if something goes wrong
- Working with others – taking part in paired or small group activities
- Following instructions – reading and listening to simple step-by-step guidance

These skills are developed gradually through supportive practice, helping learners feel safe, encouraged, and successful.

### **Joining requirements**

This course is a practical and theory-based course which requires strong command of English language. You will need to have:

- Good understanding of the English language and if you are an ESOL learner you must have at least a Level 1 qualification.
- If an ESOL learner is at Entry Level 3 but has good comprehension skills and can understand verbal and can read written instructions, will be able to enrol – subject to the assessment result.
- You are expected to understand using a computer at Entry Level 3 or demonstrate proficiency at that level.
- A pre-course interview is required where you will be given a skills assessment.

## **Proof of Learner Identity**

All certificated courses require you to show proof of your personal identity. Please bring the relevant IDs on the **first day** of the course. Refer to the list below.

### **List of documents to show proof of learner identity**

To comply with the new exam board regulation, you will be required to show proof of your identity before you could sit for a formal assessment.

**All Learners** must bring proof of identity to the first session.

You are required to provide either:

- **One** item from the first list; or
- **Two** items from the second.

#### **List 1: One item required**

- Passport.
- EC identity card.
- Full driver's licence (with photo).

#### **List 2: Two** of the following which are currently in use, are required

- Standard acknowledgement letter (held by people seeking asylum).
- Rent book/tenancy agreement.
- Current credit card or charge card.
- Bank or Building Society book.
- Letter showing home address.
- Full driver's licence (non-photo).
- ES40 and JSA agreement.
- Medical card.
- Services identity card.
- Household Utility bills.
- Bail sheets.
- Original birth certificate.
- Marriage certificate.
- Senior Citizen travel-pass with photograph.
- Any other form of ID.
