What will I need to provide myself?

Watercolour Paints - Any good make including W.H. Smith's own brand. Colours should include Cadmium Red, Cadmium Yellow, Ultramarine, Viridian and Perm. Rose.
Palette - Deep wells for mixing large amounts of colour for washes.
Brushes - Start with the following brushes. 1 x size 16 round, 1 x size 8 round and 2 x size 4 round.
Paper - 140 lb NOT- cold pressed paper is called NOT and has a slightly textured surface. It can be obtained at W.H. Smiths in a block size approx. 10 x 14". (Note: cartridge paper is not suitable)
Absorbent paper/Soft Tissue - for wiping out and general uses.
A3 drawing board (optional)
HB pencil & eraser Total Cost – approximately £25 minimum
Please also bring a pen and your glasses if you need them.
Your tutor will discuss materials further at the first class.
Please check that the class is running before buying anything.
